

1 to 3-11-13 Sports Day was celebrated with enthusiasm and grandeur in the parish campus.



A MARRIAGE SKETCH - THE HOLY FAMILY OF NAZARETH



Bill Keane, creator of the Family Circus cartoon strip tells of a time, when he was penciling one of his cartoons and his little son Jeffy said, "Daddy, how do you know what to draw?" I said, "God tells me". Jeffy said, "Then why do you keep erasing parts of it".

Ah! wisdom from the mouth of babes. We seem to like this past time activity to invoke God and call Him the master artist and yet while on the canvas we like to do our own penciling to suit our plans, thus erasing what does not tally with our minds and plans.

This is the great lesson that we could pick from the Holy Family of Nazareth. Like any other human family, they were dodged by concerns, doubts and even questioned the plan of the Divine. But once they agreed that God was going to tell them what they are to do, they stuck to that belief and let him have his way. In as much as they were tempted to erase parts of the plan, they let go their own and allowed God to write their lives anew.

This family of Joseph, Mary and Jesus is known as the Holy family because GOD was the centre of the family. It was possible because first and foremost Mary and Joseph **listened to God** and owned **God's will as their own**. The famous "Yes" of Mary and Joseph is highlighted, but we are not to forget that their initial word was a "No". How can this be? asked Mary, and Joseph in the Gospel of Matthew secretly planned on giving her a divorce. This relying on God's word enabled them to accept one another as they are. They both had their individual minds but an inner listening led them to saying "Yes" and so they did not erase any part of God's designs. Thirdly, they lived the vows of marriage that couples take. They stood with one another thick and thin, in good times and in bad. They were there for each other when there was no place for them in the inn. The flight to Egypt was long and tedious, yet, they stood by one another without grumbling, blaming or accusing.

In the light of this we are to reflect if God is the centre of our Christian Homes. Do we allow God to draw up plans? Are we accepting of the diverse personalities who make up our homes? Do both spouses accept each other and offer human and spiritual space for the other to grow both as individuals and also as a couple. Are parents accepting of children and youth? Are we journeying as families in difficult times without escaping, laying blame on the others, being ashamed of the ones we think are the black sheep of the home? Do we stand by our family members? Standing by, means to be standing besides someone in a static manner, but really it means standing by in a verb form. Families are called not to be static but in constant action with and for the other. Like Mary who continued her constant being with Jesus which finally led her even to stand by the cross. Definitely a difficult plan sketched out by God for someone who was to be called Jesus, Yeshua which means God is my help/ God saves.

But Mary did not erase any part of the story. In allowing the hand of God to write and draw a new salvation history, we today along with many over the centuries have inherited the Gift of New life and salvation. Let us keep and use erasers to rub away and erase our mistakes. But God's Plans, NEVER!!

"Glory to God in the highest, in heaven and on earth, peace among those Whom he favors" was the song of the angels at the birth of Jesus.

Through our Baptism, each of us too has become the favoured one of God. As we celebrate Christmas, may we echo this song of praise, song of joy As families that have God at its centre like the Holy Family of Nazareth.

SIN DIVIDES...GOD UNITES

Marriage is arranged by God. It's a divine intervention. Jesus says: "but from the beginning of creation, God made them male and female - for this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. So they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate." (Mk 10: 6-9).

This sacred union is top priority in God's list. As a matter of fact, the first book in the bible speaks of the union of Adam and Eve (Gen 2-3) and brings into focus, towards the end of the New Testament, the union of the Bride (the church) with Her Bridegroom, Jesus Christ (Rev 19). As we look closely at sacred scripture, it becomes very clear that a marriage is that which God unites or takes responsibility in joining. It is for this reason that Jesus, quoting out of The Word of God in Genesis 2 said, "What God has joined…let no man separate" (Mt 19: 6).

After creating Adam, God wanted to complement his life with a companion, and so, the creation of Eve. Looking at her, Adam acclaimed, "This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh" (Gen 2: 23). Bone symbolises strength and flesh symbolises weakness Adam acknowledges in the presence of God and accepts his partner both in strength and in weakness. The unifying element is God alone. He conjoins the two persons in one. But it is sin that brings division. The desire for greatness over God enters their thoughts and division takes place between them and God. Adam's complaint of "The woman whom you gave to be with me, she gave me the fruit and I ate" (Gen 3: 12) puts a kind of divide between him and Eve too SIN DIVIDES.

Marriage is awesome! It is God's idea before 'Sin' entered the world. Therefore, marriage is something that is 'Heavenly'. With God's involvement in married life, we experience "Heaven on Earth". The sad thing is that the presence of doubt, misunderstanding, arguments, etc. can mar a relationship as beautiful as marriage too! God's presence in a marriage acts like an adhesive to unite the couple, that no worldly force will destroy. Sin divides but God Unites.

MARRIAGE, A CELEBRATION OF LOVE

If I tell young people of today that I hardly knew my husband, that our conversations had been very brief before our marriage, they will be in a total disbelief. How can such a marriage last? They will question me. It did last and is still lasting decades after his death. Till today I remember him with love. A true Christian marriage lasts forever.

In the present age, more so in the developed world, (where I make frequent family visits) people have no faith in marriage. Most of the marriages break down. It is supposed to be a free world, young and old are free to live as they like or with their partners as they like. For these people the virtue of virginity is a passé word. It is to be mocked and laughed at. It is common to see young teenagers going about with their babies in their prams. People grumble about their sick society. If there is no God, no morality and no marriage, the society in any part of the world will indeed be sick!

During my youth in Goa, practically all marriages were arranged marriages. Our parents considered marriage as a lifelong commitment. They worked towards the endurance of this commitment. They took the words of the sacrament of Matrimony "till death do us part" seriously. They taught us by word and example the sanctity and permanence of marriages. Even our Hindu friends believed in the same way. Because of our strict moral upbringing in Christian values and prayer life, young Goan men working abroad returned to their native land to seek their brides. They believed that girls with such background will be good wives. This paradigm is valid in today's age too. Fear of God and morality are necessary for a good marriage.

In my own marriage, even though my husband and I were totally different persons, there was a common bond between us, that is our Faith. God was most important for us and we prayed together. Our constant prayer brought us closer together that the words of the Scripture "the two shall be one", "They are no longer two but one" became real for us. Christ became the 3rd unseen Partner in our marriage. (The revered spiritual writer, Bishop Fulton Sheen says so in one of his writings). The Lord poured His love into our hearts to make our marriage the most beautiful relationship, a celebration.

Dear readers, I am sharing my experience of marriage so that your marriage too can be a celebration of love. We are mortals and if we depend on our human love, it cannot last. We need the infinite love of Christ to make our permanent marital commitment, the most beautiful human relationship.

Good marriages are so very important in our modern world. Wherever there are good marriages, there

A couple and their family is a gift from God and how we live with our family Is our gift to God.

THE GREATNESS OF MARRIAGE



A wedding day is always a joyful occasion. A great deal of effort and much preparation ensures that it will be the best day in the lives of the couple getting married. Most newly wedded couples believe that life will be a smooth run from them on, but unfortunately, this belief does not always come true. Two different people living together day in and day out is not easy. Sooner or later disillusionment sets into their lives and they cease to enjoy their relationship. They feel disconnected often, as their expectations are not met. Sometimes they enter into an abusive, distressed relationship. These days it is common to hear of couples, who mutually agree to dissolve their marriage because they "can't get along" or think they are incompatible. How can an ailing relationship be revived and energized so that they can once again enjoy the beauty, joy and passion that was once theirs? It is important that couples are aware of what marriage entails. "Marriage is a legitimate union between a man and a woman to build a lifelong community of love, in which children are born, are nourished and grow into maturity.

The Church's view on marriage is more profound. The Church has elevated marriage to the status of a Sacrament THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY. The uniqueness of this Sacrament is that the couple ministers the Sacrament to each other. THEY ARE MINISTERS OF CHRIST'S GRACE TO EACH OTHER. We will understand better when we realize that the Sacrament of Matrimony is a visible sign of Christ's love for the Church. We married couples are called to a special relationship through our Sacrament. We must make known the unconditional, forgiving, healing and accepting love of Jesus by the way we respond to each other in a loving, caring, forgiving manner.

Marriage is also a covenant relationship that cannot be broken. A man and woman enter into a covenant with each other and God. A covenant is a promise to be faithful to each other no matter what. In the Old Testament God made a covenant with Noah and Abraham. So we know that marriage is important, beautiful and HOLY. It is a lifelong commitment wherein couples are invited to work at their relationship every day of their lives to connect and enhance it.

HOW DO WE BUILD A GREAT MARRIAGE

Over years of striving, we have learnt some techniques that have worked for us. We would like to share them. First of all we must admit, for a marriage to be an enduring bond, the most important fact is DEPENDANCE ON GOD. Without God's grace it is not possible to have a strong relationship.

IMPORTANCE OF PRAYER: It helps us to set aside time, a few minutes each day for couple pray. We thank God for all the blessings and graces He has given us and ask Him to give us the strength and grace to accept His Holy will in everything we do each day. There is deep contentment and inner peace that comes from living life in union with God.

GOOD COMMUNICATION: We honestly share our innermost feelings - positive and negative, our hopes, fears and also LISTEN to each other with the heart (This is not just hearing).

TRUSTING OUR SPOUSE IMPLICITLY: We need to trust our spouse to be truthful, faithful and responsible in whatever he/she does. Giving the other the benefit of the doubt when necessary.

ACCEPTANCE, APPRECIATION AND AFFIRMATION: It is important that we accept our husbands / wives for who they are with their strengths and weaknesses. We also need to appreciate the good things they do rather than focus on things they haven't done.

FAITHFULNESS AND RESPECT are also important ingredients in a good marriage. We are called to be loyal, faithful and dependable. We should show respect by speaking well of each other. We should also be polite and courteous to each other, within the family.

INTIMACY is expressing and communicating our love for each other. This deepens the bond between husband and wife and helps us to grow in harmony, unity and love.



Most important is **FORGIVENESS AND HEALING**: Accepting your spouse when both know that what he/she has done is unacceptable and hurtful is very difficult, specially when there is no assurance of complete amends. So we ask God to help us to forget our quarrels and hurts and reach out in love to heal each other.

Every married couple is called to be a powerful sign of the tender, loving, merciful love that God has for all men. Our loving relationship, the love, patience, understanding and forgiveness we show each other every day, in good times and bad, in sickness and in health, in riches and poverty, is the way we are called to witness everyday. So that people can know the Father's love for us. This is the greatness of our marriage. How can people learn of the Father's love for them if they do not see our love for each other?

In no way do we, Joe and Edith claim to be the ideal couple. Inspite of being married for forty-four years, we still continue to struggle to keep our relationship strong and stable. It is a daily struggle. There are successes and failures. When we succeed we thank God, and when we fail, we ask His help and God has never let us down. We do not have a perfect marriage but we do share a wonderful marriage. Our married life is filled with varied experiences some happy some funny and some so unexpected and beautiful; but there have also been experiences, that were sad, painful and some filled with deep sorrow. We have gratefully accepted the good times and don't regret the painful experiences, for, with strength from above, we have emerged stronger and more caring and sensitive towards those in pain.

We still have arguments; and disagreements occur, but we have learnt it is better to be in RELATIONSHIP, than to be RIGHT. We have learnt never to let the sun go down on our anger. Our relationship has improved and enhanced with the passing years, thanks to our close involvement with the Marriage Encounter Movement, that has been instrumental, in helping us, to renew and strengthen our relationship with each other.

THE MARRIAGE ENCOUNTER MOVEMENT helps to make good marriages better by providing useful guidance to a richer life together. It is for couples who desire a fuller and deeper relationship. Even the best marriages can find new meaning and joy. It is good to experience the Marriage Encounter weekend, not because you need it, but because you deserve the best.

We as couples have a tremendous challenge to come up to the ideal of Jesus "Love one another as I have loved you" (Jn 15:12) Can we try to be more loving, understanding and less critical? Can we strive to be more trusting and forgiving? YES, WE CAN!! With God's grace and blessings and our own willingness, efforts and determination, it is possible.

Soon we will celebrate Christmas, God entering into our world in simplicity, as one of us. May we enter into each other's world every day, in simplicity and love and strive to be life giving to each other, our family and our community.

May the JOYAND PEACE OF CHRISTMAS BE WITH ALL OF US.

4th Article (For Private Circulation Only) 10 LEGAL RIGHTS EVERY WOMAN MUST KNOW



1) Free legal aid:

Exercise your right to free legal aid. It is necessary to have a lawyer with you while you lodge the FIR, so that there is no risk of being misquoted or the statement being tampered with.

2) Right to privacy while recording statement:

Section 164 of the Criminal Procedure Code states that, a woman can record her statement before the district magistrate and no one else needs to be present. Alternatively, she can record the statement with only one police officer and woman constable.

3) Time doesn't matter:

The Supreme Court has ruled that the police must register an FIR even if there has been a gap between the report and the occurrence of the incident. If the police informs you that they can't lodge your FIR since you didn't report it earlier, do not concede.

4) Email to the rescue:

If, for some reason, a woman can't go to the police station, she can send a written complaint through an email or registered post addressed to a senior police officer of the level of Deputy Commissioner or Commissioner of Police. The police can then come over to the residence of the victim to take her statement.

5) Cops can't say no:

A woman has the right to lodge an FIR at any police station in the city under the Zero FIR ruling. This is a Supreme Court ruling that not many women are aware of, so don't let the SHO of a police station send you away saying it "doesn't come under his area".

6) No arrests after sunset:

According to a Supreme Court ruling, a woman cannot be arrested after sunset and before sunrise, even if there is a woman constable accompanying the officers. In case the woman has committed a serious crime, the police has to get it in writing from the magistrate explaining why the arrest is necessary during the night.

7) You can't be called to the police station:

Section 160 of the Criminal Procedure Code states that, a woman cannot be called to the police station for interrogation. The police can interrogate a woman at her residence in the presence of a woman constable and family members or friends.

8) Protect your identity:

Under no circumstance can the identity of a rape victim be revealed, by the police or media. Section 228-A of the Indian Penal Code makes the disclosure of a victim's identity a punishable offense.

9) The doctor can't decide:

A case of rape can't be dismissed even if the doctor says rape had not taken place. A victim of rape needs to be medically examined as per Section 164 A of the Criminal Procedure Code. Rape is crime and not a medical condition. It is a legal term and not a diagnosis to be made by the medical officer treating the victim.

10) Employers must protect:

According to a guideline issued by the Supreme Court, it is mandatory for all firms, public and private, to set up a Sexual Harassment Complaints Committee, to resolve matters of sexual harassment. The committee should be headed by a woman and comprise 50% women as members. Also, one of the members should be from a women's welfare group.







Pope Francis emphasized that family is founded on the sacrament of marriage, referring to matrimony as "a first sacrament of the human."

WWH (We Will Help) Charitable Foundation Inaugurates its Community Centre on 20th Oct 2013

It was a historic day for WWH Charitable Foundation to set up its first Community Centre in one of the 32 slums of Aarey at Unit 22, Aarey Colony, Goregaon East, Mumbai 400 065 on 20th October 2013.

The Centre's objective is to uplift the whole underprivileged community by providing grass root training programs for children, women, youth and adults in 4 areas: 1) Education 2) Health 3) Community development 4) Learning and Skills development Program

In the sphere of **Education**, following Training Programs have already been initiated a) Computer Basic, Tally, DTP, Hardware b) Martial arts c) Music & Dance
There are other training programs being worked out on a long term: MSCIT, Mobile repairing, Nursing, English speaking. Various Cultural activities, Drawing, Arts & Crafts and Library facilities are also planned. In the sphere of **Health-** first Medical Camp was successfully conducted on 17th Oct 2013 by tying up with Larsen and Toubro Health Care centre. Over 120 patients benefited from the Health Camp. Plans are underway to conduct a Blood Donation Camp which has never been conducted in Unit 22 so far. Health awareness and basic nutrition programs will be focussed in the long term.

In the sphere of **Community Development** Cleanliness, Hygiene and Sanitation; Environmental awareness; Counselling; Legal advise & Self Help groups are in progress.

In the sphere of **Learning and Skills Development Program-** Sewing cum Tailoring Programs and Beautician & Mehendi training have already been initiated. Embroidery, Social Enterprising programs are in plans.

Fr Charles Fernandes, Parish Priest and Spiritual Director of SSVP, St. Vincent Pallotti Church, Marol kindly blessed the Centre followed by Hon Chief Guest Bro John Lobo, President of Central Council of Bombay formally inaugurating the Centre with cutting of the ribbon. The program then commenced with lighting of the traditional lamp by trustees of WWH who were then felicitated with a bouquet of flowers by Mrs Varsha. This was followed by a lovely Patriotic Dance program conducted by Mr. Dinesh and his troupe of underprivileged children.

Fr Charles Fernandes expressed his happiness over the birth of WWH and gave his blessings and best wishes for the growth of WWH. Fr Charles expressed his confidence that the efforts of WWH will transform lives of the urban poor. Bro John Lobo, President of Central Council of Bombay appreciated the works initiated by WWH and stressed the need for hygiene in the community to prevent spread of diseases like Dengue which has been quite rampant in the country. Mr. Anthony Francis, a trustee, who is also the President of the Area Council of SSVP, NW III and President Lions Club of Mumbai Metro who has been working quite closely in this community for over a decade, spoke about how vital the role of WWH is and will be to further the cause of development of various areas of the community. Dr Janet Hendricks, one of the Trustees, who is also President of Lions Club of Sujok spoke in Marathi stressing the importance of the role of WWH in bringing about various government programs/benefits to the masses which they have so far not even been aware of. Mr. Amaldas, one of the trustees spoke in Tamil and stressed how WWH would work together with the Community and how important is "Team work" to bring about holistic growth of the community. Mrs Marina Fernandes, a trustee, who is also the Secretary of Central Council of Bombay and SSVP, St.Vincent Pallotti Church, Marol so beautifully convened the whole inauguration program.
