Well Begun is Half Done...

The importance of a study Time Table

The summer vacations are over and school has begun. The first month of school is usually the settling down period. All the excitement and distractions of the holidays should slowly come to a stop. The mind and body is fresh and ready to take on the challenges of the new academic year. Before you rush off for long hours of after-school tuitions, it is important to organize your time and effort so as to give the academic year your best.

1) Set aside a fixed time for academics

3 hrs a day should be set aside for studies daily. Of this, completion of homework should not take more than I hour. Ensure that you keep to the fixed time.

2) Keep a fixed place for study

It is important that children have a fixed place in the house for study. Preferably a table and chair in a room that is well ventilated and has good lighting. (Sofa and beds are not the place to sit to study). Make sure that the TV is off during the study time. Keep distractions – mobile phones, visitors, to the minimum during the study time.

3) Do your work daily.

Read the chapter being taught in class, on your return home. Attempt the questions at the back of the chapter to check if you have understood the lesson.

4) Prepare a study Time Table

A study time table helps to distribute your time over the different subjects. At least 2 subjects must be revised during the study time, giving 45 minutes to each subject. Subjects that you find difficult and practice time for Math, must find extra time in the study Time Table.

Study Time Table must be written and followed regularly.

Remember well begun is half done. The only person you have to compete with, is yourself. A disciplined attitude to your academics will make it interesting, easy and will help to dispel stress and fear at the time of examination.

A study time table is an instrument of Time management. Planning the use of your time allows you to make time for recreation (outdoor play, TV, reading), time for family interaction (prayer, dinner, fun time) and will ensure that you get the necessary amount of sleep.

The Legal Page

3rd Article (For Private Circulation Only)

(For the Information of the Co-operative Housing Society Committee / Office Bearers and the Members.)

By virtue of the 97th Amendment in the Constitution in 2012 by the Central Govt., all states are required to modify their Co-operative Societies Act, in order to bring uniformity in the State Co-operative Act throughout the country. Accordingly out MCS Act 1960, is amended by the ordinance dated 14.02.3013, in consonance with the provisions of the 97th Amendment.

The 97th Constitutional Amendment and Maharashtra Co-operative Societies (Amendment) Ordinance 2013, mandates that all Societies adopt the 'Amended' Model Bye-Laws to help maintain the balance of Authority.

Accordingly, as per the new Bye-law no. 173(a), the Co-operative Housing Society is now bound to form a Grievance Settlement and Redressal Committee, as provided u/s 89AB of the Act.

Further according to **Bye-law no. 173(b)**, the General Body of the Society shall appoint a Grievance Settlement and Redressal Committee to hear and settle the grievances of the members. When referred to, such complaints and grievances shall be settled by this Committee, as far as possible within 3 (Three) months.

Bye-law no. 173(c) further details the Composition of the aforesaid Committee.

The Register for active members shall be maintained by the Society and accordingly if a member does not attend 5 (Five) General Body Meetings continuously, shall be treated as an inactive member, along with the earlier applicable restrictions. Therefore, the new amendments in the Act compels all members in a Co-operative Society to attend at least one AGM in a span of 5 (Five) years, failing which the rights of the members shall be inoperative. Even such members can be expelled, treating them as inactive.

As per Bye-law no. 115, the next Managing Committee (M.C.) shall have the following number of members:
